PURPOSE

This policy seeks to

POLICY AND PROCEDURES

- Michigan State University College of Osteopathic Medicine (MSUCOM) students may seek to
 establish a provider-patient relationship for medical care with physicians that they know in
 clinical or academic settings. This may be because of convenience, proximity, familiarity, and/or
 trust.
- 2. While MSUCOM students may seek care from the health professionals of their choosing, once a therapeutic relation is established, the treating physician (or other health professional) must recuse him/herself from:
 - a. Participating in academic or clinical assessment of the student.
 - b. Participating in decisions related to advancement or graduation of the student.
 - c. Participating in MSUCOM committee reviews of the student's academic or professional performance (e.g., COSE).
